The Falklands war stuck with me because it was so far away and yet in every ones living room.

I think thats the first time I considered the Military as a career. 1985 after leaving school I started a YTS at Brooke Motors in longroyd Bridge. The 3 and a half years there helped me focus my life and apply myself.

For a brief time I joined the 3rd York's battalion as a Private. This helped me to get successfully apply for a position the the Royal Air Force I was employed as an Aircraft Electrician

My duties were maintenance of Tornado GR1b ground attack (Bombers) aircraft on my leaving day from 12 squadron I was given a "backseat" flight in a Tornado. 1Hr40

of Joy & terror that I will never forget. From there I worked on helicopters in Belfast where my main duties were Search & Rescue

For my 2 years service there I was awarded a medal for service

My final year with the RAF was at RAF Coltishall in Norfolk

My main duties were working on any Aircraft that visited the station except the Jaguars Aircraft stationed there.

I was lucky to meet a few dignitaries but the most memorable was the day I marshalled the Red Arrows at RAF Coltishall.

The travel is second to none...

Upon leaving the RAF I got a job with Subsea7 as a Remote Operated Vehicle (ROV) technician. With my background it seemed like natural progression.

These ROV are unmanned Submarines that are generally used by oil companies for various tasks offshore. From assisting with Oil Well Drilling & Work overs to construction of oil fields although we do on occasion do things like aircraft blackbox recovery

I have worked for Subsea7 for over 17 years where I have progressed to a senior offshore position

I can hand on heart recommend this as a career but with a word of warning

If you want to be home for your kids birthdays, or if you love a family Christmas this isn't the job for you. There is a good chance that you will not be home for funerals

Angela my partner has never faulted in being the best as she handles the children and my absence admirably

I joined the Golcar Winkle Club about 5 years ago. I'm sure anyone local is aware of our work we do try to help locals and improve the appearance of the village. This club has been going for a long time and has a proven history for helping & I am proud to be a member of this club



I was born and grew up in the village of Golcar an only child and grandchild and was christened at Golcar Baptist church. I attended Manor Road Infant school, Knowle Bank Junior school and Colne Valley High School to complete my education. I was a regular user of Golcar Youth club in the 70's and was the first carnival queen in Golcar around this time.

After leaving school my first job was as an office junior for Kirklees education department where I

worked until commencing nurse training in Huddersfield at the age of 18. My ambition had always been to be a nurse since the age of 5 when my grandfather had bought me a nurse dressing up outfit, this passion for the career has never left me. Since qualifying in 1979 I have worked in several areas of the profession with the exception of career breaks for the births of my 3 children, Victoria, Alexandra and Oliver.

In the late 1980's I opened a clothes shop in Huddersfield which I ran until the birth of my son. I returned to nursing first working in a local nursing home then moved out into community nursing where I completed the Specialist Community Practitioner Honours degree in district nursing graduating at the age of 49 something I never thought I would ever realise in my career.

I worked as a Community Matron, Discharge Coordinator and District Nurse over the past few years until commencement of my current role, which is clinical manager for district nurses in Calderdale last year.

My grandfather Alfred Wall was the last owner of Golcar Ritz cinema which closed its doors for the last time in the mid 50's due to the increase in popularity of television at the time.

I am very proud to be the grandma of 5 children ranging from the age of 5 months to 10 years, Jamie, Louise, Jasmine, Ben and Maisie who give me a lot laughs and pleasure.

I have many happy memories over the past 50 years of Golcar and the time spent whilst living In this lovely village which I will always treasure and have always been proud of being able to call myself a Golcar Lily.

Golcar Village

Guided ginnel walk

Join Golcar's Environment group on this popular walk around the village's ginnels and further afield:

Time: 1.00

Meet: St John's Church gates, Church Street

Distance: approximately 3 kilometres.

A shorter walk is also possible.

Duration: approximately 1 hour 30 minutes

There are 3 fairly steep climbs but they are only short. Wear suitable footwear, and if required bring a stick or walking pole. Maps are available on Lily Day from the library and the Golcar Lily Day stall in the car park at Town End.

Beyond Golcar's ginnels, this walk takes you past a well-hidden but spectacular weaver's cottage and then along the canal towpath. Mid May is an ideal time to walk along the towpath as the trees look beautiful with their lush foliage. You might even see the electric-blue flash of a kingfisher as it darts past you.

Minibuses

As well as all the entertainment in Golcar, there's also lots to do at the venues. Two free minibuses will be operating on Lily Day to drop you off at a venue and then either take you to another venue or bring you back to Golcar. Hop aboard to visit Bolster Moor, Sycamore Avenue, Golcar Baptist, Scapegoat Hill, Parkwood and Providence.

Park and ride is available from the Pennine Manor, Scapegoat Hill.



Dog Wardens

Leymoor Cricket Club

It was a good season for Leymoor First X1 who finished fourth in Section A, their highest finish in this section since 2006. The team only lost 3 league games all season but the weather conspired against them and valuable fixtures were lost at crucial times. The core of the side is still from the village and indeed rose up through the junior section of the club, there has been a number of signings in the last couple of years and due to league organisation they will compete in the Premier League in 2015.



The second X1 were Champions in 2013 and had another good season in 2014 and finished mid-table, there are a lot of youngsters in the side and this is invaluable experience as the club moves forward. The vast majority of the lads are from the village and with a selection of players at the older end there is a nice mix.

The club are looking to expand their junior section again and an exciting link with a local school is proposed to feed in to the senior teams. The club is also fundraising to replace the existing building in preparation for a possible league move in 2016.

BRINGING YON

Golcar Village

Golcar Racecourse

In the 1870s and 1880s there was a horse-racing track near the Rising Sun pub on Leymoor Road on a big area of open land known as Golcar Flat. Flat races and steeplechases were held and many of the horses that took part were kept in the stables of the Rising Sun.

The Steeple Chase became renowned, attracted thousands of spectators - many of whom drank in the pub - and had a purse of 40 sovereigns, which today would be equivalent to £3,364.

Sovereigns had a nominal valuation of £1 but were also used as gold bullion. If a

winner had kept the sovereigns for a rainy day, they would be worth today £14,400. An 1880 sovereign is today worth approx. £360.

One of the most successful horses to take part was Lady Golightly, when she died one of her hoofs was made into a commemorative ink

In 1884 the stand collapsed, preventing further proposed development.

The Golcar Flat has since been built on, although opposite there is a road called Derbyfields. Maybe to remember the areas racing past?

Ceremony Shire Horses

Since 1960, delivery horses have been a big part of Daniel Thwaites heritage, and until very recently they still delivered beer to our pubs within the Blackburn area.

And although we now use vehicles to deliver beer, our horses are not forgotten. In fact, they have a very hectic schedule throughout the year with appearances at numerous horse shows and events to raise money for charities up and down the country.



Our aim is to promote walking locally by:

This year Colne Valley Museum is 45 years old and its volunteers have even more reason to celebrate, having secured a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to renovate and refurbish the row of weavers' cottages at Cliffe Ash which house the museum.

Our dream is to establish a period bedroom in the end cottage so that we will have a complete weaver's cottage with living kitchen and wash cellar, bedroom and loom chamber for visitors to appreciate what life as a handloom weaver was like in the mid 19th century.

A new meeting room is also planned, for the use

of local groups, as well as better facilities for our visitors and schools, and a Community Heritage Resource Centre will be created to enable greater access to the museum's collection, especially for those tracing their family history.

By the time the Golcar Lily Day festivities are over the museum will be closing its doors for a few months to enable the extensive building work to begin.

However, we will not disappear entirely!

The Museum intends to 'pop up' in all sorts of places, to enable the public to keep abreast of what is happening with the project, and we may see you at the many summer events such as Honley Show (Saturday June 13th) and Meltham Memories weekend (Saturday July 4th).

We'll also be going out to visit schools because they can't come to visit us, as well as giving talks to local groups and societies.


