The group was founded in 1951 by John Ripley, who became Scout Master. Cubs soon followed in 1954 and some years later the Venture Scouts (now Explorer Scouts) and Beaver sections were formed. In total there are now 150 people in the group and we can offer scouting to everyone in Golcar from the age of 6 upwards.

Over the years the group have met at various locations around the village, including the Baptist Church, Manor Road School, Knowl Bank School and Golcar Community Centre. In March 2011 the group took on management of the Community Centre and we can now call this building our true home.

2011 is the group's 60th anniversary year — we have lots of special events and a commemorative badge,

pictured, to celebrate our diamond jubilee.

"Why me?", said Joan when she found out she had been awarded an MBE in 2008 for services to the community in Huddersfield. The instant response from anyone who knows her would be "why not you?" Joan has a lifetime of connections with Golcar; she was born in the village, went to Knowl Bank school before moving on to Greenhead High School, and for 27 years she worked at F Drake & Company of Golcar Ltd until she retired. She has great affection for Golcar: "Everyone talks to one another and there's a united feel", she says, "It's still a village and being on different levels adds to its character."

Another Golcar connection began in May 2006 when the Golcar Lily Day Group was formed. "I saw an item in the Examiner about a meeting to establish a festival for Golcar," she says, "What really caught my eye was that the meeting was on my birthday. I soon became secretary of the group and this is a job I really enjoy doing. There is a wonderful atmosphere on Lily Day, with people coming together and working together." You are unlikely to see Joan on Lily Day as she will be working behind the scenes in the library, helping to coordinate the day.

Outside of Golcar, Joan does an enormous amount of voluntary work: 25 years with the scouts in Longwood, working with the Beavers; over 20 years at the Sunday school in Longwood; and at the magistrates court in Halifax, helping with the witness service. She has also been a school governor at 6 different local schools. She does manage to find some time for relaxation: "I'm a keen reader and I enjoy spending time with my family and grandchildren", she says.

In her Golcar Lily talk, Joan will tell you about her life and work, including the day she ran away from home at the age of 3, the day she collected her MBE at Buckingham Palace, and what she said to Prince Charles. Her talk is sure to be one of the highlights of this year's Sing.

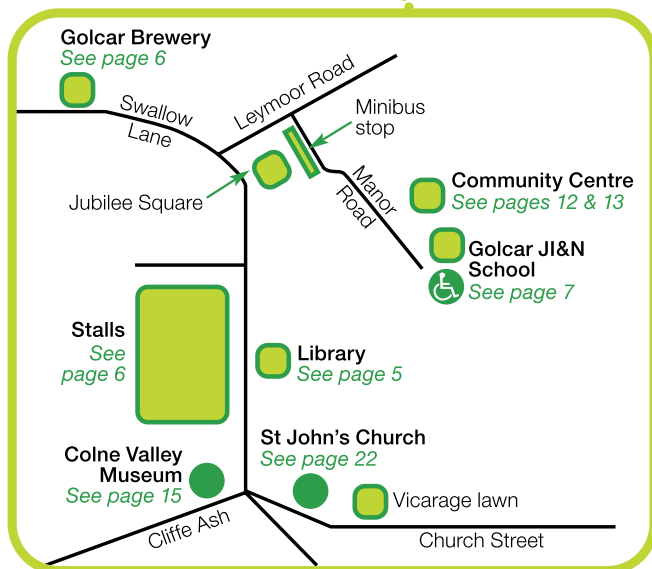
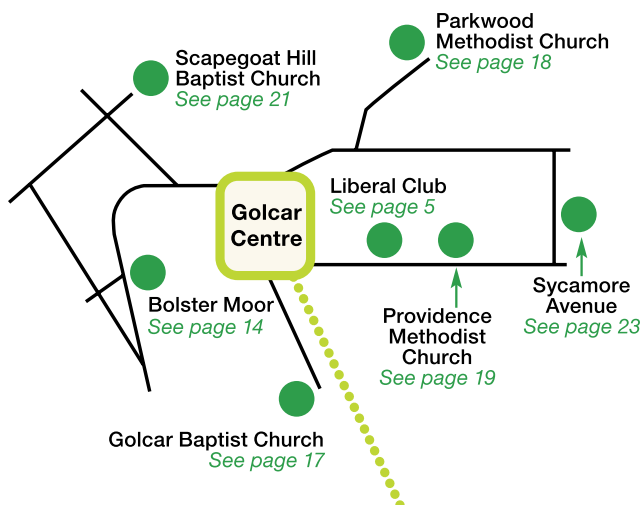

After much planning, work is now underway on our expansion. Recent work has restored some original features: the top cottage now has mullioned windows, stone slates and ridges, and a cleaned and repositioned date stone, pictured below. Inside, we are making structural alterations and adjusting floor levels. The Heritage Lottery Fund has financed all this work and we are very grateful for their help. In addition to the planned work, we have

found an old well in what will be the museum's new entrance — the challenge now is how to present this amazing feature to our visitors.

Our education team has gained national recognition by winning an award from the Heritage Education Trust for their 'outstanding contribution to heritage education and learning within the historic environment'.

We continue to recruit new volunteers steadily but there are still many opportunities available — the museum's expansion will need many hands and many different skills. These are exciting times; are you interested in joining us?
