- Treasury £6456 at the moment, setting up nicely for next year. Cheque from the Providence on the way. Still no invoice from Historia Normannis for the past two years, Louise to look into.  
Beech school raised some money and gave £200 to Golcar Lily Day.
- Legal Permission to use the car parks has been done. School field and church field for the fun run is good. St. Johns is fine – Manor road we've not heard from yet, still need permission from Manor road for the use of the school field.  
Road closure people are booked. Licenses have not been done yet but Sue will sort it shortly.
- Stalls 7 stalls already booked – about par for this time of year.
- Music Kirklees musica have agreed to stay at the Prov. They are desperate to have send a band somewhere but we cannot accommodate two spaces.  
Simon said a possibility of a tent in the memorial garden at the church for people to perform (maybe Kirklees musica)  
We will start telling everyone about the theme and bringing it together with the music for the day.  
We are still short on venues for the music as usual. We need to contact the liberal and the con-club for venues for music.
- Procession Suggestion of moving the procession to 2pm from 11am as there will be more people around to watch.  
Concerns over clashing with other events in the village. Suggestions of being able to tie in the procession with the fly-past that Sue Starr has organised.  
Phil to speak to WWII re-enactors to figure out if they will be around/join the procession.  
Volunteers to speak to John Myers to bring some items for the village as well as the procession, also a potential for Military vehicles to line up rather than tractors.  
Idea for something for the children to join in with – evacuees to be coming to Golcar. Louise to look into finding evacuees for the children to represent and Rowena to head into schools to talk to the children about it.  
SWEAT to be informed about the change to the procession.

- Bunting** People are producing bunting both crochet and knitting.  
Schools to be given small triangles to decorate  
Businesses to be given bigger ones to put up around the village.  
Craig & Soo to look for Union flags to put up around the village too.
- Legion** Sue Starr has written to the legion to tell them what we are doing –not quite sure if there will be a response but the letter has gone.
- Street Party** Tables and chairs for the party are sorted (we think)  
Long white table cloths requested.  
Tables will be used for people to use when they have bought food from around the village.
- Maps & Info** Sue Starr suggested a collapsible frame to put the maps and information for the day in with a flag above it advertising the events around the village.  
Potential for easels to be found around the village.  
Sand bags to weigh them down and add to the theme of the day.
- Fun Run -** Sue Starr to tell Mike we are not doing it this year.
- Shops** Phil keeping in contact with the shops for bunting purposes.  
Sue Starr has talked to the estate agents who is potentially holding another competition for the children to design a tea towel suggestions welcome for another idea other than a tea towel.  
Window displays from the shops – Louise to sort posters from the war to put into the windows. Soo suggested doing them in A3 as we can then laminate them and protect them from the weather if necessary.
- Scouts** To look into the allotment folks doing something on the day – similar to dig for victory.
- Entertainment** John to contact Morris Dancers  
Dance groups to be contacted  
Potential for a piano player to come down (maybe from the university) – although we would need a piano for that to happen – everyone to look out for a piano that we could use.  
John to come and do the announcing again.
- Environment** Planters will be planted  
Request to highlight the Pat Swallow Memorial Woodland on the map for people to visit.  
There will be a project morning every month and there will be a launch of a big campaign in April in the run up to Lily Day for a spring clean.
